ETIQUETTE REMINDERS FOR COMPETITORS AND THEIR FABULOUS SPECTATORS

Reminders for Riders:

In the Warmup:

- Pass left shoulder to left shoulder when riding by another rider in the opposite direction.
- Give vocal heads up to your fellow riders, for example, yelling "passing inside" as you approach or calling out the fence you're going to jump.
- Keep at least one horse length between you and other horses
- Do not lunge in the warm-up area
- Share warm-up fences generously, and don't raise fences to heights outside the level preparing to compete.

In the Common Areas:

- Keep your time in the wash racks as short as possible, as many people may need to bathe horses at once
- Respect volunteers and honor their requests. In return, we promise not to ask anything unfair or embarrassing!

In the Ring:

- Don't enter the ring until the rider before you has exited.
- Salute your dressage and jump judges and listen for your start whistle or bell.

Reminders for Spectators:

- Horses always have the right of way.
- Children and pets must be closely supervised. (NO dogs off-leash)
- Avoid any action that could be interpreted as an "unauthorized assistance" to a competitor. This includes — but isn't limited to — things as: giving advice and directions to a rider, clicking, waving, or shouting to encourage a horse to jump. The penalty is ELIMINATION for the rider. (you can clap and cheer *after* the horse has cleared the obstacle.)
- Should a horse or rider fall, officials and medical personnel will respond immediately. Please make sure to stay well back to give them the opportunity to do what they are trained to do.
- If the horse is loose, you may catch him but if you do not have experience with horses, the most helpful thing you can do is to get out of the horse's path and call for help.

AMATEUR STATUS: For all returning USEA members, Amateur status will be automatically transferred each year. It is the responsibility of each competitor to inform the USEA of any changes to their status. The benefits of amateur status are not retroactive. Amateur status begins at the time it is declared to the end of the current competition season. A fine of \$50.00 will be assessed for all Amateur exemption petitions to the USEA.

PLEASE READ – USEF DEFINITION OF AMATEUR STATUS

USEF Rules for Eventing Appendix 3, Section 4.4: **AMATEUR RIDER (AR)** - The following may participate in Eventing competitions as an Amateur. **A)** Any competitor in possession of a valid Amateur Card issued by the USEF, or **B)** Any Senior USEA member who competes in the Training, Novice or Beginner Novice level who meets the requirements of Federation GR1306. Individuals declaring such status must present, upon demand, an audited financial statement in support of the claim of eligibility; failure to do so will be deemed a violation. Misrepresentation of eligibility under this provision will subject an individual to disciplinary action under GR1307.6, GR1307.8, GR1308.3 and Chapter 6. Amateur certification under this provision is valid for Eventing competitions only and does not confer Amateur status for participation in any other Breed or Discipline.

USEA MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES

A rider competing in any USEA recognized competition, at any level, must hold a Full, Junior, Collegiate, or Life membership and have an approved and current medical armband. (A fee of \$100 will apply to consider re-instatement of qualifications for the current year championships and current year-end awards, only). USEA requires ALL foreign competitors to be members of the USEA in order to compete at USEA recognized competitions.

EVENTING TESTS: Derby Cross, Coach Allowed Test (CAT), or Schooling Show competitors who are non-members will not be required to pay a non-member fee to compete. To use the USEA X-entry online system, an ID number must be created. ID numbers do not require membership and can be created by going to the USEA home page and clicking on Online Services. Click "New User?" to create profile. All forms can be found at www.useventing.com. **Postage Note:** *Eventing USA* magazine is mailed at the periodical rate.
